For this reason Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters, <sup>12</sup>saying, "I will proclaim your name to my brothers and sisters, in the midst of the congregation I will praise you." <sup>13</sup>And again, "I will put my trust in him." And again, "Here am I and the children whom God has given me." —Hebrews 2:10-13



Beloved Siblings in Christ,

Doesn't it jangle a little bit on your nerves to see a Merry Christmas greeting arrive *after* Dec. 25<sup>th</sup>? I mean, it takes so much effort to get there that it is practically a relief to be past it and moving on. And this year, wow, with the triple-demic of Covid, the Flu, and RSV hitting us like a freight train as we all tried to make merry. Did any of you come through December without a sniffle or a two-week ride on your sofa and some antibiotics? Everybody seemed to be sick at one point or another. We ran the gauntlet, and we are heading into the new year now.

And yet, I bring a word of Christmas again because there are 12 days of Christmas. The church season of Epiphany does not begin until Dec. 6<sup>th</sup>. What could be the purpose of these 12 days? And how should we use our time and fill such days? Maybe we should rely on the guidance of Mary and Joseph in this, by staying put, being present, and enjoying one another. Thankfully, in most cases, when you give birth to a human child you get to take a little break and just be. People you know and love might come by to be with you, but usually in a not demanding way. We don't expect a lot from a person who has just given birth to a human child. The kitchen can be dirty, the laundry can be stacked up, they can tell us they need a nap now.

Maybe that is what 12 days of Christmas are for us to embody—cozy contentment and wonder, ample rest and happiness. Maybe any dressed up theological reasoning for such a stretch of time is just a fancy way of giving us all a breather. So check in on yourself, take stock, what can you take off of your plate right now and just be relieved of for minute or two? How can you live into the 12 days of Christmas and be a little more relaxed and rejuvenated?

God, through Jesus Christ, knows all about our suffering. The Holy One knows what burdens we carry, where it hurts, and where the scars ache. And God, through Jesus Christ, is bringing us through our suffering, the world's suffering, out into redeemed places and being. God, through Jesus Christ, is sanctifying your lived experiences, our lived experiences. To sanctify something is to make it holy. To make something holy is to set it apart, to dedicate it, to purify it. Suffering is not holy, but God entered into the same experience of human suffering as the pathway to redeem our lives from suffering and the effects of suffering. Sanctified, we are made siblings of Christ, the Son of God, our Redeemer, our Savior, our Teacher. We are given space to live in the blessing of God's way. Let us not neglect to do so.


