Sunday, May 28, we celebrate Pentecost

"Pentecost" comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth day. On this day, the Holy Spirit came with wind and flame, empowering the disciples to proclaim the good news of the risen Lord to all people.

Falling on the fiftieth day of the season of Easter, Pentecost represents the culmination of the church's seven-week celebration of Christ's resurrection. As the Lord's Day (Sunday) is sometimes called the "eighth day" of creation, Pentecost is a day of new creation—all things transformed and made new by the word and breath of the living God. On the day of Pentecost we give particular thanks for the gift of God's Holy Spirit, who gathers the church as the body of Christ and sends us to share in Christ mission throughout the world.
