Pastor's Page

²⁴Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor. Jn 12:24-26



Beloved brothers and sisters in Christ,

This passage from the Gospel of John about life and death, holding and releasing, losing and gaining, limited life and eternal life, and serving God is an important one to attend to as we practice being disciples of Jesus Christ. Last week, Session met for one of our "strategy" meetings and we wondered together about how best to lead when we have to, first and foremost, attend to serving God's mission for this church, and yet, that very mission is one that includes welcome and maintaining space for a diversity of points of view and preferences among the congregation. In other words, how do we pick a path for the congregation, if picking a path might cause some among us to say, "I am not called to that path." In other other words, what if we leaders of the church come to understand where God is calling us all to go next as a congregation, but choosing to follow that calling causes the church to split apart? (We were ONLY wondering!)

And there we come back to the words of Jesus recorded in the Gospel of John. God calls us to risk for better things again and again and again. When we are feeling the most comfortable, the most satisfied, that is when God asks us to drop our tidy little seed back into the fertile ground and let it spring forth in newness. And as disciples, we come up against our resistance to that again and again and again. Which is why we are practicing together (in every stage of our lives) how to keep trusting in God's providence, grace, and unfolding Kingdom. That is what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. That is what it means to be a Church.

The Session and I keep returning to the needs and desires of this congregation named in the 2020 CAT Survey of this church. Among the top priorities named by this congregation were for leadership to "provide more opportunities for Christian education and spiritual formation at every age and stage of life;" and to "strengthen the process by which members are called and equipped for ministry and fellowship." How we go about that will definitely look differently that how we did it in 1973, 1983, 1993, 2003, and even 2013. Education has become more integrative. Children do not go to classrooms and listen to lectures. Good teaching now encourages hands-on, practice-style learning that engages different intelligences within the same exercise. And this aligns more closely with the way Jesus taught his closest disciples: get started, try it out, practice, ask questions, practice, ask more questions, figure out the way you do it and share with the class, repeat.

Did you realize that this summer worship was also a classroom for adult education and spiritual formation in which we were being equipped for ministry? Because, it was. When we were all taking time to consider the scriptures together, we were dipping our toes into 1) thinking from our own perspectives about the living Word of God among us, and 2) practicing speaking about our faith, thoughts, insights, and even confusions and doubts. I could have held a summer adult Sunday School in which some of you with extra time listened to me teach the history of discipleship in the church and describe best practices for spiritual formation and equipping the saints in our current day and time. That could have been very satisfying. I love a good class taught by a wise and well-researched professor. But it wouldn't have gotten us any closer to growth and development. It wouldn't have required us to wrestle with the tension points within us. It wouldn't have given us the opportunity to try it again after it was weird, and not just what we wanted the first or second or third time. It wouldn't have gotten us any closer to dropping our precious seed in to the turned up dirt.

I promise, conversation in the sanctuary will not be the way we continue doing worship. The experiment will conclude at the end of August. But there will be other opportunities to practice speaking in faith together. And Jesus will keep smiling, and giving us little nudges, saying, "C'mon, don't be chicken!" (Matt 14:22-33)






REQUESTS FOR PRAYER


Young People's Reflection In Worship Sun. Aug. 13, 2023
