Pastor's Page

Beloved Siblings in Christ,

We have completed our Stewardship Campaign. Thank you to all of you who have made a financial pledge for the coming year. Thank you to all of you who have pledged time and talents as well. This is what we do as followers of Jesus who are called together into a congregation. Together, in the Holy Spirit, we provide from our resources for the ministry of this place and this moment.

As some among our number are considering church membership, I think it is worthwhile to cap our Stewardship campaign with some words about what church membership entails in this congregation. Because each community of faith orders its life as it sees fit, within the mandates of its denomination.

Membership in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) requires baptism (only once), renouncing evil, claiming Jesus Christ as Lord of one's life (that is, he sets the rules by which one lives), promising to practice the activities of discipleship, and promising to actively participate in the life of the congregation (because congregations are called together for mutual support, see quote above). Most PCUSA congregations, including ours, expect that members will contribute financially to the maintenance and upkeep, the mission and ministries, and the pastoral leadership of the church. And, as congregational life continues to adapt to the times in which we live, we hope that all regular participants in this church's worship, mission, and fellowship will contribute time, talent, and treasure, regardless of membership status. A note on tithing: some denominations require that members "tithe," that is, contribute 10% of their income to the church. The PCUSA does have a financial requirement for membership, but considering the biblical idea of tithing when we decide our annual contribution to the church is a worthwhile practice.

As to the "active participation in the life of the congregation" that I mentioned above, what does that entail? The Book of Order states the following,

"A faithful member bears witness to God's love and grace and promises to be involved responsibly in the ministry of Christ's Church. Such involvement includes: proclaiming the good news in word and deed, taking part in the common life and worship of a congregation, lifting one another up in prayer, mutual concern, and active support, studying Scripture and the issues of Christian faith and life, supporting the ministry of the ministry of the church through the giving of money, time, and talents, demonstrating a new quality of life within and through the church, responding to God's activity in the world through service to others, living responsibly in the personal, family, vocational, political, cultural, and social relationships of life, working in the world for peace, justice, freedom, and human fulfillment, caring for God's creation, participating in the governing responsibilities of the church, and reviewing and evaluating regularly the integrity of one's membership, and considering ways in which one's participation in worship and service of the church may be increased and made more meaningful." *G-1.0304 Ministry of Members*

I encourage you to take stock. Inquire of yourself, what do I give to the support of God's mission in the world as compared to what I would give if I was tithing? How have I participated in active membership in the past compared to the present?
