Some of us will be called to accompany younger people in our midst in the work we do together as a congregation. Some of us will be called to bravely engage the questions that are bigger than all of us, with the humility and truth that we don't have all the answers, but we have practices and community to help us grow in wisdom and understanding. And some of us will be called to create and hold the space for those interactions, employing our resources and abilities to ensure they are available and on-going. How are you called? And what kind of support and equipping do you imagine you will need to live into that calling?

In coming Sundays you will be hearing about another opportunity to serve that is closer to home, in Bowling Green, actually. We are partnering with 1st Pres. of BG and the Cocoon to build a dog-run at the shelter. I hope we FPC congregants will all inquire about how we can each support this project and encourage the faith-growth of our young people by joining them in this opportunity to serve in the pattern of Jesus Christ and empowerment of the Holy Spirit.


CABELL-LINCOLN WORKCAMP

A Letter to the Congregation Concerning Stephen Ministry

You are probably aware by now that we are reviving the Stephen Ministry at our church. This is a ministry of care that not only supports the minister's pastoral care of congregants, but also equips those of us called to caring ministry. Are you feeling the call? **Because...**

WE ARE LOOKING FOR STEPHEN MINISTRY CARE-GIVERS

There are hurting people all around us....and you can help! As you look into your heart and consider this opportunity, the questions and answers below might help. If the Spirit is prompting you, contact Pastor Katie or Sue Fyten for an application, so we can consider it together.

WHAT KIND OF CARE WOULD I BE PROVIDING?

As a Stephen Minister, you would be providing emotional and spiritual care for a person going through a difficult time in life. The two of you would meet twice a week for about an hour, and you would do a lot of listening, empathizing, asking questions, praying, and overall providing your care receiver with a safe place to express and process through thoughts and feelings.

I'M A CARING PERSON, BUT NOT A SKILLED CAREGIVER. WHAT IF I SAY OR DO THE WRONG THING?

Before being matched with a care receiver, you will be extremely well trained in how to care and relate to hurting people in a distinctly Christian way. A lot of the training includes what to say or do...and what not to say or do...when people are facing difficult situations. The training includes a lot of discussion, skill practices, and activities to help you grow as a caregiver. It also emphasizes trusting God for the care receiver's healing – even if we make mistakes along the way.

WOULD I BE EXPECTED TO GIVE MY CARE RECEIVER RIDES,

PREPARE OR DELIVER MEALS, HELP AROUND THE HOUSE, RUN ERRANDS, AND THINGS LIKE THAT?

No. The role of a Stephen Minister is to provide emotional and spiritual care, not to offer assistance with practical or physical needs.

HOW LONG DO CARING RELATIONSHIPS LAST?

It varies depending on the needs of the individual care receiver. Some caring relationships may last just a few months; others may last a year or more. Each caring relationship lasts until the care receiver has moved beyond the crisis and no longer needs care and support from the Stephen Minister. (continued)

HOW WILL I BENEFIT FROM THIS EXPERIENCE?

Stephen Ministers often say that being able to walk with people through challenging times in life is a tremendous blessing. It's a great opportunity to use your caring gifts in meaningful ministry. You'll also learn many caring and relating skills that will be valuable in how you relate to family, friends, coworkers, and others.

WHAT'S THE TIME COMMITMENT FOR SERVING AS A STEPHEN MINISTER?

For the initial training, you'd be attending 20 class sessions, with each one lasting 2½ hours. They're scheduled to fit in easily with people's day-to-day responsibilities. Then, as a Stephen Minister, you'd visit your care receiver once a week for about an hour. You would also attend two meetings a month for supervision and continuing education.

HOW DO I APPLY?

You can start the process by filling out an application form. Katie and/or Sue has these forms. Then we'll arrange a time to meet with you, find out more about your interest in getting involved, and answer any questions you may have before making a decision together.


Let's Skate Away!
