Dear Members and Friends of FPC,


Come Meet Gur New Youth Leaders!

	Clean 4 rental house basement window wells . Clean & prime 6 basement window wells in the older part of the church building
	Put a white, exterior top coat on the fence in the back yard and on the back of the main church sign
	Consult with Tom L. & Don Y. about painting interior door of church at alley entrance
