

## Pastor's Page:

"Jesus is Lord" — Romans 10:9

Dear Members and Friends of FPC,

I have recently been preparing for the annual meeting of the homeowners association of my condominium complex with a bit of chagrin. It feels difficult to get consistent information from the Board throughout the year. But I do not think the board members are maliciously keeping information away from residents. I imagine



that they just get busy with "doing the work" and forget that as leaders they need to communicate with the rest of us so we know what is going on and how to participate. I had the thought, "Boy, they need to send out a short, monthly newsletter!" This made me chuckle just now, because I was just thinking I didn't have anything to write to you this month. And then I pivoted to wondering about what you all wish you had more information about.

Church finances are pretty good. We had some unexpected expenses due to the pipes and a water heater in the rental house across the street, but honestly, the house is in good shape, and continues to be a trusty source of income for the work of our church. You all have asked for multiple adult education opportunities, as well as good leadership for children and youth. We have a variety of adult education opportunities available this fall, and we are transitioning with our new youth leaders into meeting up with our young people when *they* are available, which is not necessarily traditional days and times anymore. Choir will be starting up fairly soon, and we are blessed to have seasoned and highly respected choral leadership available to us in our new music director.

As we continue to equip and be equipped for the callings to which we are called, the Session has endeavored to begin apprenticing new leaders into established roles held by trusted church leaders so those leaders may rest, and also so new leaders can be trained and empowered. We have tried to be very inviting to all church members to join in the work we do via various teams, and we still hope more of you will continue to present yourselves as co-workers for our common mission. Particularly, we ask for helpers on the Stewardship and Finance Team, Communications and Technology Team, and Facility Management Team. These have intimidating titles, but truly, being helpful is as easy as being the note-taker and agenda-maker, the question-asker, or the phone-caller. Wouldn't you love to learn how to run the worship recording on Sunday?

Stewardship is about to kick-off, because Session has moved forward the budget preparation for the coming year. We found that it hinders our work as the Session to have the budget be finalized in the year it is meant to resource. So, a congregational meeting to approve my 2025 Terms of Call will happen this fall, to aid in budget preparation. (Stephen Potts would LOVE it if you piped up and volunteered to help him with Stewardship!)

Session will be implementing upgrades to the overall safety of our building this fall, and we will be telling you all about them when we have them settled. We will focus on doors and access. And now I am just wondering what else you might want to know more about. I think we all feel a lot better when we know what is going on in our community, whatever size it is. And I do hope you feel like you know what is going on in our church and that you have a way to participate.

The Hebrew word "shalom" is normally translated as "peace" and often used in our culture as an opposite to war. Or we use "peace" to describe what we are seeking in our spiritual lives.

But neither usage adequately captures the complexity and richness of shalom. In fact, shalom as the absence of war is only periodically used, and even then, it describes more about security than a lack of violence. And rather than it being an individual goal, shalom is most often used in scripture to describe the wealth of blessings found in relationship with God and one another.



Using scripture, selections from the study guide, and lots of discussion, this study will explore the many meanings of the Hebrew word shalom and the Greek word eirene.

The introductory gathering will be on Wednesday, August 28th. Bring a Bible (or find one in the church!) but no preparation is needed. If you didn't sign up yet and want to come, please do!
