Having seen them, what feelings and thoughts did the objects evoke in you?

Did it make you think about objects in your own home that mark parts of your faith story?

Would you be willing to bring something like that in to share with the congregation?

You would bless us if you did.

As we develop into a congregation that promotes peace through sharing sacred story, I want to make sure that I say to you all that our stories are indeed precious and our own. We share them when and where we see fit, and cannot and should not be coerced into putting our personal journeys and experiences on display when we do not want to. We are not entertainment for one another. We are companions on the journey.

The gospel writer Mark remembers that once, when Jesus was being thronged by interested people who wanted to see him heal someone, he stepped away with one man and restored his hearing and speaking in private, away from the audience. That man's speech was restored for when and where he felt called to employ it. Others who saw him healed went on and on about it, but we don't know what that man that day did with his own story. We know, simply, that he was opened. Praise be to God.

It takes a lot of work and a lot of intention to create and maintain space of trust, of listening, of freedom, not pressure, and of respect. We've been taught so well to argue, and size-up, and be ready for our turn to talk. We've been taught how to ask "smart questions" and how to quiz someone on what they are trying to transmit. So there's a lot of static, there's a lot of background noise if we are not careful and practiced in hearing with our eye as well as our ears, understanding with our souls as well as our brains. It takes intentional effort to let the Holy Spirit drive, to take our hands off the wheel of what we assume or what we project.

Sometimes people in our community need time to collect evidence from our sustained actions that prove us trustworthy to receive their stories. Sometimes people need to see others jump up and grab the mic, to get a sense of how it might be done. Sometimes people need there to be enough moments of quiet to get a word or a thought in. Sometimes people express their faith, their journey, their witness in ways other than words neatly strung together.

A tradition maintained and sustained is a story. A hoot and movement with a lively hymn praises God from whom all blessings flow. A remembered date honors the sacredness of life. An object on the shelf can be the key that unlocks the journal of experience. A cup of coffee or tea shared in a shop echoes communion. A place at the table and in the pew is a gift. And a word shared that fills your heart or lifts your hairs is holy.




ADULT BIBLE STUDY NEWS




