Beloved siblings in Christ,

Our mission as a congregation becomes very important now. God has work for us and it is the work of God's Kingdom. Now our practices become very intentional. We are those who are creating and holding space in our community for connecting with one another in truth and openness, for caring, compassion, and for loving-kindness. We are those standing at the gate of God's Kingdom, lamp in hand, showing the way into shared wholeness, regard, and recognition.

I ask you to mark your calendars now for a church event on the winter solstice, Saturday, December 21. It is an off-site event, in the evening, at the home of the Hollar-Chavez family. This gathering will include dinner and time for the practice of sharing story. We want you to be able to attend, so we ask that if you do not drive, or do not drive after dark, that you accept a ride from someone else.

The winter solstice is, of course, the longest night of the year. People often gather on this night around a fire for a ritual of divesting of something from the year now ending and holding hope for something in the year about to begin. The season of Advent holds the same elements. Advent begins with or at least includes, naming the great need of the world for a savior and then prepares for that savior to come. Our theme for Advent this year



is "From Generation to Generation: There is room for every story."

The part of God's mission of healing the world that we have been given to pursue in this place at this time is peacemaking. Your church leadership have come to understand that by building on our longtime identity as a location of Christian hospitality, we can now begin to grow into a place and a people who indeed make room for every story. This is a loonngg term project. But we have already begun to adjust our attention and practices to living it.

At the Dec. 21, church gathering there will be a story-telling component to the evening. So! Storytellers! Start thinking about this theme: LEFT BEHIND/LEAVING BEHIND. We are going to hold a Mock-Moth Story Slam at the gathering. That means we need 10 among us to bring a 2-5 minute story, that is (1) true, (2) autobiographical, and (3) has something to do with leaving something behind or once having left something (or someone!) behind. Ideally, your story will have a full arc of beginning, middle, and end. Be bold! Let's practice together telling and receiving stories. Bonus points if yours has a spiritual component (I mean, we are a church after all!). God provides. God calls us forward. Let's go where we are sent! Pastor Katie

Michael Garofalo (MG): Hey everybody. This is the last episode of our season called Stepping Up... and we're releasing it on Election Day 2024.

Jasmyn Morris (JM): And this particular election has been more stressful than most.

MG: And that stress has a way of bringing out the worst in us... and at times... it seems like it's tearing us apart.

V1: The climate that we're operating under has everyone on the defensive.

V2: You see a person and you automatically put them in a box, and say, "Well, this is what this person should be like."

V3: All of this, ostracizing people, what are we afraid of?

JM: So, StoryCorps does a lot of different things... but it's really all about connecting people... whether it's the participants in the interview... or someone even just listening on the radio or this podcast.

MG: And the thing that makes it possible to connect... even if it's a total stranger you're listening to... is that at StoryCorps... people talk about the very things that make us human.

V4: We're called to love one another. It can't be, I reject you as a person.

V5: It was important for me to meet somebody who really didn't have horns and a tail. (Both Laugh)

JM: The voices you're hearing are participants in our One Small Step program... where we pair strangers with opposing political views to have a conversation... NOT about politics... but just about their lives.

V6: This country's been through so much, its people has been through so much. Why can't we fix this?

V7: Do we have issues we have to deal with? Yes, we do. But we're not going to be able to deal with them if we're fighting and yelling at each other and not listening.

MG: So as you can imagine... It takes a certain amount of courage to sign up for one of these interviews... and when it comes time to sit face-to-face... it can be downright nerve-racking.

Leigh Ann: I've been shy all my life. I have terrible anxiety, and I just see this effort as so important. So even as my hands are clammy, and my face is turning bright red like a tomato, I'm gonna push through because this matters more to me than my discomfort.

JM: I'm Jasmyn Morris.

MG: And I'm Michael Garofalo. It's the StoryCorps Podcast from NPR.


Thank You, Sarah!
